- Prophecy: bold about speaking and teaching God's Word
- Teaching: able to communicate knowledge and truth
- Exhortation: a relational ability to encourage and admonish
- Shepherding: the gift of spiritually nourishing and growing believers
- Mercy-Showing: able to sympathize with and support others
- Serving: gifted with helping and serving in practical ways
- Giving: a capacity and desire to serve God with material generosity
- Administration: gifted in leading people and programs.

Worship Ministries

The beautiful liturgies offered at St. John's Episcopal Church require much preparation and the support of lay volunteers. Whether serving up front at the altar or behind the scenes, there are many opportunities for parishioners to serve God and the worshiping community, in a way that is personally enriching and fulfilling.

ACOLYTE

Acolytes assist the clergy during services, leading the procession with cross and candles, helping to set the altar for communion, ringing the bells and generally making sure things run smoothly. Acolytes play a vital role in our church's worship. Children 8 years and older and adults of all ages serve in this ministry. Training is provided.

Time Commitment: 1 to 2 hours per month.

ALTAR GUILD

The Altar Guild's work consists of preparation for and cleaning up after every Eucharist, including baptisms, confirmation, weddings, and funerals, celebrated in the main church and the chapel. The Altar Guild also serves an important role in the church by caring for liturgical objects, linens, vestments, and altar hangings. They are responsible for cleaning and mending, polishing, and all other necessary tasks. Women, men, and youth (12+) are encouraged to participate. Training provided.

Time Commitment: Approximately 2–3 hours a month.

CHOIR

St. John's Cantate Deo Choir is a beautiful ministry that seeks to sing to the glory of God with all heart and soul of its members. The choir leads St. John's congregation in worship by singing our liturgy and hymnody. The choir sings for Sunday II:00 service throughout the year along with Christmas, Holy Week, Easter, and other feast days. The choir meets for midweek rehearsals at 7:00–8:30 p.m. on Wednesday evening and I0:30 (I/2 hour prior to worship) on Sunday mornings. Everyone is welcome and there are no auditions. Enthusiasm and a desire to honor our Lord are the only requirements. Come make a joyful noise unto the Lord.

Time Commitment: Approximately 3–4 hours a week.

GRFFTFR

Greeters serve a valuable role in welcoming newcomers to St. John's. You will be the first point of contact and help others become familiar with St. John's services, programs, and events. Greeters represent the "family" of the church as they welcome newcomers with warm friendly greetings, exchange names, and gather contact information so we can stay engaged with them and follow up after their visit. Greeters also offer newcomers a parish gift, invite them for coffee after services, connect them with other parishioners, and introduce them to the clergy. Families, youth, and adults are encouraged to join.

Time Commitment: Serve as a greeter I Saturday or Sunday a month, arriving I5–20 minutes before and after services; approximately 2 hours a month.

LAY EUCHARIST MINISTER (LEM-CHALICE BEARER)

LEMs are specially trained and licensed to serve the chalice and read the Scriptures and the Prayers of the People at the Holy Eucharist. They also serve as Subdeacons at the Sung Eucharist, standing alongside and assisting the celebrant. As a LEM you would be responsible for attending periodic meetings, rehearsals, and refresher classes, usually held on Saturday Mornings. Training is provided.

Time Commitment: LEMs serve approximately once every 2–3 weeks. They arrive 30 minutes prior to the appointed service time and leave approximately 20 minutes after the service conclusion. Rehearsals and refresher sessions usually last approximately an hour.

Ushers welcome worshipers, help with seating, and attend to worshipers' needs during the service. They are part of our front line of hospitality for the visitor's experience. Ushers are vital to our parish's worship. They begins with greeting and welcoming visitors and parishioners, guiding people to their seats, directing the flow of the communicants to and from the altar, carrying the alms of the parish to the altar at the Offertory, lending assistance to any person, and answering questions about St. John's. Training is provided.

Time commitment: Approximately 2 hours a month.

CHILDREN/YOUTH SUNDAY SCHOOL TEACHERS

Sunday School teachers help the Christian Formation ministry accomplish its mission by modeling an authentic Christian faith while facilitating courses that help develop mature disciples of Christ in thoughts, words, and deeds. The teachers are responsible for leading a Sunday School class, starting at 10:00 a.m. Sundays on a weekly basis for the agreed-upon duration of the course. This primarily consists of facilitating the curriculum and guiding the discussion. They should invest time each week to thoroughly prepare to lead the course and, as needed, converse with the church and/or CYMC staff members to receive encouragement, support, and training, as well as time for prayer and troubleshooting.

Time Commitment: 2–3 hours per week (I hour in class plus I–2 hours in preparation).

AUSTIN STREET CENTER SANDWICH PROGRAM

The sandwich program is a parish-wide activity in which participants young and old, men, women, and children/youth, reach out to the less fortunate in our immediate community and in the greater Dallas Area. Once a month, on the first Saturday of the month, the Sandwich Program volunteers meet at 10:00 a.m. in the Parish Hall and prepare sandwiches to be transported downtown to the Austin Street Center.

Time Commitment: Volunteers serve on teams of 6 and serve approximately 1–2 hours a month 3 times per year.

REINHARDT ELEMENTARY

St. John's a long history with the Reinhardt neighborhood, with our parish's first service taking place at Reinhardt Elementary School in 1946. We continue to care about this school by supporting its needs. Opportunities include volunteering as readers, tutors, library and teacher helpers, event support, and providing items for the school's teacher and students.

Volunteers during the school day are needed Monday–Friday for 30-minute time slots between 8:30–10 am, on a case-by-case basis. Volunteers are needed throughout the year at special events, such as the Halloween Festival. In order to be a reader, tutor, or any type of volunteer inside the school and/or events you must sign up through DISD.
